Can you identify a tree in winter? Oak? Ash? Beech? Without leaves it can be hard to distinguish one tree from another. Enhance your winter forest forays and impress your friends by learning to recognize trees through branching, buds and bark clues.

The <u>WCA</u> will offer a free winter tree identification program, Saturday, February 18. Tim Fleury - <u>UNH Extension</u> forester - and Ann Davis - Wilmot Tree Farmer - will lead the workshop. It will start at the WCA Red Barn, 64 Village Road, with a short talk and slide show.

After the talk, Fleury will lead the group on a stroll to a nearby property where participants will observe trees in the field.

Prepare for an outdoor experience and dress for winter weather and snow conditions. This program is sponsored by the <u>Wilmot Community Association</u>. Unless weather conditions are extreme, it will take place snow or shine.
